
The Sunday of the Passion: Palm Sunday

About Palm Sunday

The liturgy today recalls both the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem and the apparent defeat of his crucifixion. Following the blessing of the palms, the congregation processes to the church proclaiming the Lord in song. When we reach the church, the focus shifts to Our Lord's Passion—his betrayal, condemnation, mocking, and shameful death. As we come to recognize that, like the Judeans of Jesus' day, we too are inconstant in our loyalties to God, we realize that Jesus' sacrifice of love is made for us as well, and for the whole world.

The Triduum at Grace Church

The Mass we celebrate today begins the celebration of Holy Week, the most sacred time of the Christian Year, which commemorates the final week of Jesus' earthly life and ministry. Holy Week culminates in the *Triduum Sacrum*, the "Three Sacred Days" of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday's Great Vigil of Easter. Our full participation in these liturgies makes us witnesses, by faith, of "those mighty acts by which the God of our salvation gave us life and immortality." The schedule for that three-day liturgy, and for The Sunday of the Resurrection (Easter Day) can be found at the back of this leaflet.

The Liturgy of the Palms

The congregation gathers in a place appointed away from the church. The following anthem is said.

Celebrant	Blessed is the King who comes in the name of the Lord;
People	Peace in heaven and glory in the highest.

Celebrant Let us pray.

Assist us mercifully with your help, O Lord God of our salvation, that we may enter with joy upon the contemplation of those mighty acts, whereby you have given us life and immortality; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

Here the account of the Lord's entrance John 12:12-16 is proclaimed by the Deacon, first saying

People	The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John. Glory be to you, O Lord.
The Palm	Gospel: John 12:12-16 (see readings insert)
People	The Gospel of the Lord. Praise be to you, O Christ.

The Celebrant then says the following blessing.

	The Lord be with you.
People	And also with you.
Celebrant	Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
People	It is right to give him thanks and praise.

The Celebrant continues

It is right to praise you, Almighty God, for the acts of love by which you have redeemed us through your Son Jesus Christ our Lord. On this day he entered the holy city of Jerusalem in triumph, and was proclaimed as King of kings by those who spread their garments and branches of palm along his way. Let these branches be for us signs of his victory, and grant that we who bear them in his name may ever hail him as our King, and follow him in the way that leads to eternal life; who lives and reigns in glory with you and the Holy Spirit, now and for ever. *Amen.*

The Celebrant sprinkles the branches with holy water and the palms are distributed.

The Procession

- *Deacon* Let us go forth in peace.
- *People* In the name of Christ. Amen.


During the procession to the church all hold branches in their hands, and sing the hymn "All glory, laud, and honor".



At the church door the procession halts while the following Collect is said

Almighty God, whose most dear Son went not up to joy but first he suffered pain, and entered not into glory before he was crucified: Mercifully grant that we, walking in the way of the cross, may find it none other than the way of life and peace; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

After the Collect members of the congregation find their places in the pews and remain standing as they sing "Ride on, ride on in majesty."



- 4 Ride on! ride on in majesty! Thy last and fiercest strife is nigh; The Father on his sapphire throne Expects his own anointed Son.
- 5 Ride on! ride on in majesty! In lowly pomp ride on to die; Bow thy meek head to mortal pain, Then take, O God, thy power, and reign.

Almighty and everliving God, in your tender love for the human race you sent your Son our Savior Jesus Christ to take upon him our nature, and to suffer death upon the cross, giving us the example of his great humility: Mercifully grant that we may walk in the way of his suffering, and also share in his resurrection; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen*.
